Opening Exercises:

Pledges and a Bible reading
Praise and corporate prayer (individual needs; families; those in authority over us; our nation; the world)

Classic Literature:

Read classic aloud; learn a new vocabulary word and principle each lesson; complete notebook work

Bible Reading for Reasoning:

A reasoning with truth program in which children read the Scriptures, reason with principles, and apply to their life. Each unit pertains to one book of the Old or New Testament; a Bible verse is memorized and parent prayer and blessing cards are sent home each week to engage the parents in what the children are learning.

Snack and Exercise:

Nutritious snack provided by the host ministry; free play or organized sports

A Taste of Christian History:

God's hand in history is taught from a providential view

Wellspring of Wonder®:

Encountering the living God through biblical story and imagery that uses a storyteller, wooden story figures and underlays in a spirit of worship, reflection, and wonder. Christian imagination is cultivated for creative expression both verbally and through art.

Fine Arts through Appreciation and Participation:

Music: Lessons in listening; singing; playing rhythm instruments
The Visual Arts: Lessons in looking; sketching; painting; sculpting; crafting; calligraphy; printmaking
Poetry: Memorizing poems and Psalms
The Performing Arts: plays; puppetry; readers' theater; dancing

Culminating Festival:

A celebration of learning through festival to include parents and invited guests that includes: parade; music; creative dance; drama, or puppet show taken from the classic or Bible book studied; display of artwork and crafts; opportunity to share community service project and a simple meal coordinated with the unit study

Flex Time:

Time for community service project; festival preparation; drama or music practice; completion of a craft project

Community Service and/or Enterprise:

Teach Christian principles of service, stewardship and enterprise through campus and/or community projects

Group Sharing:

Each group shares one activity from the day (Examples: principle learned; new vocabulary word; Bible memory verse; poem; art work; song or dance)
Weekly commendations for character growth; memory work; artwork; serving others; stewardship of property; community service, etc.

Parent Participation:

Mothers' prayer cards and fathers' blessing cards (sent home weekly); invitations extended to assist with special projects and festivals; AMO® program director is encouraged to have parent meetings to build strong relationships and even teach principles of nurturing their children
