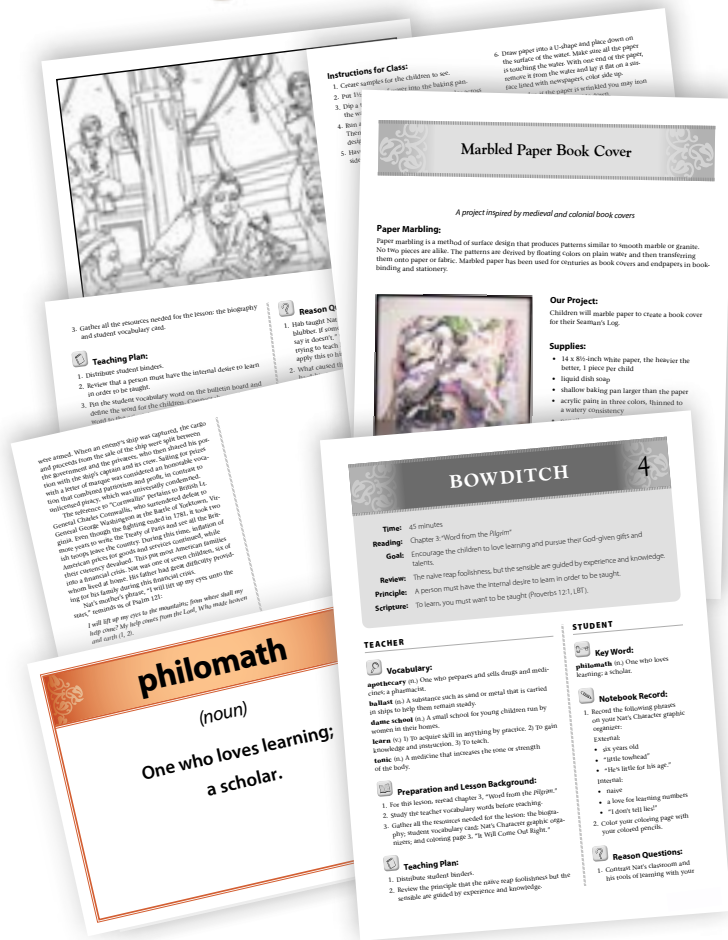


Sample Lesson Plan



The AMO® Program is an enriched curriculum for literate children of all ages. AMO® Teacher Training

The AMO® Program is both an enriched curriculum for children and Christian worldview courses for the adults who teach and disciple them. It is rooted in the transforming truths of the Word of God and imparts its virtues of beauty, truth, and moral goodness to two generations. The Program is designed to supplant the cultural strongholds and divided mindset that prevent believers from effectively discipling their families and communities for Christ. It also provides them the tools for igniting change, first in their own hearts and minds, then in others as they engage the culture around them.

Those who plant AMO® Programs in the nations are certified trainers who equip the Church to use AMO®. Each trainer must first be able to handle the biblical principles and vocabulary and the Christian methods that are woven into the fabric of our courses and curriculum.
